I hope this newsletter finds you healthy and in good spirits now that Spring has arrived. The beginning of this year has been slow, and February was very cold for a period of time. The contractors say they are bidding a fair amount for the year. If you are wanting to work in neighboring locals there is work in 393 and 444, you can either give them a shout or let me know and I can reach out to the BA's. Work should be picking up here as we go along as well. Boldt will be doing a bit of work at Nelson Power Plant starting in April with the main construction happening in September. The Rockford Casino and the plans are down state with the IL Gaming Commission. The Beloit Casino has been approved by the Governor and is looking like a September start. The bridges on I90 and 43 are just starting to take some guys. Harvard WWT will be doing a significant project this year. Library and mixed-use development downtown Rockford are slated to start this fall. Ingersoll will be putting an addition on to build a large telescope. The latest Chrysler rumor is a line for an electric car possibly at the end of the year. I am hopeful we will get the Mill furnace install which is supposed to start at the end of May.

While it is slow, that is the best time to come in and get your certs current if you have let them lapse. There are more and more contractors requiring you to be current on your weld certs to go out. Take advantage of the time off to come in and practice and recertify, it only gives you more opportunities to work. Great job to all the apprentices that where in welding block training and got certified. Block training is working, and our number of certified welders are going up because of it. Thank you to the Paul, all the Instructors and the Dean the CWI for doing what needs to be done to ensure a successful Training Program, keep up the great work.

In the last newsletter I reminded everyone of the HRA card use and keeping the bill payment under \$500 to avoid getting a 1099 at the end of the year if you did not submit your receipt to Tri-State. Well, I am happy to report that those requirements are over, I was successful at getting the trustees of the plan on board with removing the requirement of submitting the receipts for the HRA payments over \$500 and there will be no more 1099's for use on the HRA Card. So, going forward if you have a bill that needs to be paid and you are using the HRA Card pay whatever you need to pay. You will no longer have to submit the receipt and you will not have to worry about dealing with the 1099 at the end of the year.

I am hopeful we now have Kujo on board with how things are supposed to operate in Local 498, but if you see them around shoot me a text or phone call. Also, we are still not settled on our Aldridge Electric contractual (CBA) grievance and award with Aldridge having electricians (outside linesman Local 196) install security fence. I definitely got someone's attention and it has since been pushed up to the International level and the Plan (The National Building Trades) for arbitration on their (Aldridge's) claim.
